Kindness

SERVICE THEME When God acts in "kindness" in the Old Testament, it means God is being faithful to His covenant promises. It also means God is acting in generous and merciful love, providing everything for our blessing and benefit. On the night of His betrayal and on the eve of His death, Jesus' concerns were for His disciples and keeping God's new covenant promise through His Meal offering forgiveness through intimate connection to His death. We need His kindness so that His kindness might be implanted in us and expressed through us.

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION LSB 606 "I Lay My Sins on Jesus"

FIRST READING Jeremiah 31:31-34

³¹ "The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. ³² It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke My covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the LORD.

³³ "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the LORD. "I will put My law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be My people. ³⁴ No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the LORD,' because they will all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

EPISTLE READING 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴ and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me." ²⁵ In the same way, after supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me." ²⁶ For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

Pastor: These Readings are the Word of the Lord.

People: thanks be to God!

GOSPEL READING Matthew 26:26-29

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the tax collector,

the twenty-sixth chapter:

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

²⁶ While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is My body."

²⁷ Then He took a cup, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. ²⁸ This is My blood of the (new) covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.²⁹ I tell you, I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **People: Praise to You, O Christ.**

JESUS' WORDS AND KINDNESS LITANY

Pastor: On the night Jesus was betrayed –

People: Jesus showed us His kindness through giving us Himself in the Supper He gave us.

Pastor: He took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples.

People: We see Jesus' forgetfulness of Himself; we see Jesus' kindness in giving us His Supper.

Pastor: Saying, "Take! Eat! This is My body, which is given for you."

People: Jesus, You truly are the Lamb of God and in eating Your body we participate in Your death.

Pastor: And, after the Supper and after giving thanks, He took the cup and said, "This cup is the blood of the new covenant which is shed for you for the forgiveness of all of your sins.

People: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup we show the kindness and the power of the Lord's death for us.

Pastor: Do this often to remember and be renewed in our Lord's death. Come now to His Supper!
