The Problem with Pain

SERVICE THEME The problem with pain has often been expressed with a two-fold question: [1] If God is so loving, why does He allow it? [2] If God is so powerful, why doesn't He stop it? Our Gospel Reading tells us that Lazarus' two sisters sent this message to Jesus, "Lord, the one You love is sick." So, Jesus loves Lazarus, yet, He is deathly ill. And, Jesus' power, as we learn later in John, chapter 11, is power over the final and fiercest foe, namely death. So, the two questions that the problem with pain poses are dealt with. What, then, is the point of pain?

RESPONSIVE PSALM READING Psalm 13

Pastor: How long, O LORD? Will You forget me forever? **People: How long will You hide Your face from me?**

Pastor: How long must I grumble to myself

People: and have sorrow in my heart all the day?

Pastor: How long shall my soul's enemies snicker because of my pain?

People: Consider and answer me, O LORD my God;
Pastor: give light to my life, lest I sleep the sleep of death,
People: lest my enemies say, "I have prevailed over him,"

lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken.

Pastor: I will sing to the LORD,

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

Pastor: In John, chapter 9, Jesus and His disciples see a man who has been blind from birth. His disciples asked Jesus, "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he has been born blind?" In other words, is it this man's fault or are his parents to blame for his blindness. Jesus' disciples, like us, figure the cause of our struggles and our suffering is either because we are being punished for some sin or we are the victim of someone else's culpability.

People: We are sorry for such near-sighted and dangerous thinking.

Pastor: Jesus responds: "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but this happened so the works of God might be displayed in him." And the Apostle Paul clearly tells us in our Epistle Reading that we are justified and have peace with God; therefore, we don't feel guilty or get angry because of our sufferings; we actually glory in them.

People: Thanks be to God our Father for His indescribable gift of love, acceptance and forgiveness in Christ Jesus.

¹ Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² (This Mary, whose brother Lazarus now lay sick, was the same one who poured perfume on the Lord and wiped His feet with her hair.) ³ So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one You love is sick."

⁴ When Jesus heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it." ⁵ Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.

PREFACE

Pastor: Paul severely threatens those who deal unworthily with the Eucharist when he says, 1 Corinthians 11:27: Whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. This, it seems to me, means at least 2 things: [1] The body and blood of the Lord refer to Jesus' crucifixion, where His body was given over to the nails of the cross and His blood was shed for my forgiveness. If we come to the Sacrament without recognizing our faults and failures, that is, our continual need for forgiveness, we are unworthy. [2] The body and blood of the Lord must indeed be present in this sacrament for a personal and powerful assurance of forgiveness; if we doubt God's Word in this matter, we are unworthy. [Augsburg Confession]
