+ Preparing Ourselves to Hear God's Word +

INVITATION TO WORSHIP Zechariah 9:9-10; Psalm 118:22-26, 29 Pastor: Rejoice, greatly, Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! People: See, your King comes to you, righteous and victorious, Pastor: lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. People: He will proclaim peace to the nations and rule from sea to sea. Pastor: The stone that the builders rejected People: has become the cornerstone. Pastor: The LORD has done this, People: and it is marvelous in our eyes. Pastor: This is the day that the LORD has made; People: let us rejoice and be glad in it. Pastor: LORD, save us! People: LORD, grant us success! Pastor: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD! People: We bless you from the house of the LORD. Pastor: Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; People: and His steadfast love endures forever! Pastor: When we were Baptized into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, we became citizens of an everlasting kingdom wherein

we do nothing from selfish ambition, but in humility value others above ourselves, not looking to our own interests but to the interests of others.

All: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be. Amen! **INVITATION HYMN** LSB 340, vv. 1-3 – "Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates"

Lift up your heads, ye mighty gates! Behold, the King of glory waits. The King of kings is drawing near; The Savior of the world is here. Life and salvation He doth bring; Therefore rejoice and gladly sing: To God the Father raise Your joyful songs of praise.

A righteous Helper comes to thee, His chariot is humility, His kingly crown is holiness, His scepter, pity in distress. The end of all our woe He brings; Therefore the earth is glad and sings: To Christ the Savior raise Your grateful hymns of praise.

CONFESSION

Pastor: Like the Palm Sunday crowd who thronged to greet Jesus, we too naturally look for a King who comes with military might and political power to defeat oppression and heal our hurts in this unjust and inhumane world. But, even if a King fixed crushing poverty and debilitating disease and egregious inequality and death-dealing war, He would not defeat our deepest and most dangerous adversary, namely ourselves, our selfishness, our pursuit of individual and worldly power.

GOSPEL ANNOUNCEMENT

Pastor: Jesus says, "I've come to deliver you from something far more enslaving than an oppressive and unjust world. I've come as a humble King to deliver you from your basest instincts and to establish a kingdom of unconditional love, unlimited acceptance, and undeserved forgiveness where humility reigns and citizens of that kingdom see others as more significant than their own selfish whims and wants.

WE PRAISE GOD All God's People Sing 99 – "Glory Be to God on High"

"Glory be to God on high!" – This is now our joyful cry. Peace to all who live on earth, – Grace and favor for new birth. You we praise and glorify, – Worship You, O Lord most high. – Gracious Father, heav'nly King, To Your name alone we sing: Praise the glory of Your name, Now and evermore the same! Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, – Sole begotten, holy One, Born on earth from realms on high, – Born true man for us to die, Lamb of God, You take away – This world's sin: Grant peace we pray. – With the Spirit, You alone Are most high, O God the Son, And the Father, God above. Praise we now Your gracious love.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Pastor: Gracious Father, we see the Jerusalem crowd greet the long-awaited King. We too need a King in our lives – One who will defeat the destructive forces of our self-centered individualism and our lust for power. Send Your Holy Spirit that we might experience the power of this King to establish His kingdom of love and humility in our hearts and lives today and forever. We ask in the name of Jesus, Your Son and our King, the Same who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

+ Hearing God's Word +

PSALM READING *Psalm* 72:1-2, 4-7, 11-14, 17-19

¹ Endow the King with Your justice, O God, the royal Son with Your righteousness. ² May He judge Your people in righteousness, Your afflicted ones with justice.

⁴ May He defend the afflicted among the people and save the children of the needy; may He crush the oppressor. ⁵ May He endure as long as the sun, as long as the moon, through all generations. ⁶ May He be like rain falling on a mown field like showers watering the earth. ⁷ In His days may the righteous flourish and prosperity abound till the moon is no more.

¹¹ May all kings bow down to Him and all nations serve Him. ¹² For He will deliver the needy who cry out, the afflicted who have no one to help. ¹³ He will take pity on the weak and the needy and save the needy from death. ¹⁴ He will rescue them from oppression and violence, for precious is their blood in His sight.

¹⁷ May His name endure forever; may it continue as long as the sun. Then all nations will be blessed through Him, and they will call Him blessed. ¹⁸ Praise be to the LORD God, the God of Israel, who alone does marvelous deeds. ¹⁹ Praise be to His glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with His glory. Amen and Amen.

EPISTLE READING Philippians 2:1-11

¹ Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from His love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, any tenderness and compassion, ² then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same

love, being one in spirit and of one mind. ³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage; ⁷ rather, He made Himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to death – even death on a cross!

⁹ Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL READING Mark 11:1-10

Pastor: The Holy Gospel, recorded in the Gospel of Mark, the disciple of Peter, the eleventh chapter:

People: Glory be to You, O LORD Jesus!

¹ As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of His disciples, ² saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'"

⁴ They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, ⁵ some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" ⁶ They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. ⁷ When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, He sat on it. ⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. ⁹ Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted,

"Hosanna!" (that is, "Lord, save us!")

"Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!"

"Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Pastor: This is the Gospel of our LORD Jesus.

People: Eternal and everlasting praise be to You, O Christ, our King!
